Bowley	John	To the glory of God and in Memory of JOHN BOWLEY, of Whitehaven & St. Bees who was laid to rest in this Churchyard December 18th 1911, and who made the following bequests to the Vicar and Churchwardens for the time being: £300, the income thereof to be applied for the benefit of six poor aged men, and six poor aged woman of the parish of Ashton Keynes, annually. £200, the income thereof to be applied in keeping in repair the paths and grounds of the Ashton Keynes Church-yard: and £150, the income thereof to be applied in keeping in repair the Monument and the preservation of the Grave of the said JOHN BOWLEY.

Nicholas Charlotte In a vault within this Chancel Lies the body of CHARLOTTE the 6th daughter of Sir Thomas Frankland, Baronet and Admiral of the White by Sarah his wife who was the daughter of William Rhett of South Carolina esquire She was born the 9th March 1760 and on the 28th May 1778 was married to ROBERT NICHOLAS esquire of this place whose family have resided at Roundway in the parish of Bishops Cannings in this county from the year 1303 by him she had issue five sons Edward, Robert, William, Thomas and Charles and six daughters Charlotte, Sophia, Frances, Harriet, Elenor and Maria All of whom survived their Mother It pleased God that this virtuous, beautiful, and accomplished woman should leave her family when her protection and example seemed most to be wanted yet, with faith in the justice of her maker and confidence in her husband's care of those numerous pledges of their uninterrupted love, whom it was impossible to leave without regret she bore in humble hope, a long decay, which yielded not to any exertion of human skill praying for the blessing of God on her aged mother and infant children, and with her last accents affectionately calling upon her afflicted husband to support her in that struggle which was to dissolve an union commenced in the happiest season of their youth She resigned her pure spirit to her creator on the 28th of January 1800 Aged 39 Years By the side of his beloved wife CHARLOTTE is buried the body of ROBERT NICHOLAS Eqq. F.S.A. Born at Devises, April 22 1758 A Barister at Law And A Magistrate of this county He represented the Borough and Hundreds of Cricklade During the first Parliament after the Act of 22 George III was one of the Commissioners of the Honble. Board of Excise Twelve and presided as chairman thereof nineteen years He died on th 27 day of December 1826 Aged 68 Years Also SOPHIA daughter of ROBERT and CHARLOTTE NICHOLAS who died March the 1st 1866, Aged 79 Years
