

Kellys Directory Extract 1867 Ashton Keynes



Ashton Keynes is a parish, in the Northern division of the county, union of Cricklade, Highworth hundred, diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, archdeaconry of Bristol, and rural deanery of Cricklade, 4 miles west from Cricklade, 3 north from Minety station on the Cheltenham Railway, and 88 from London. The church of the Holy Cross is an ancient edifice and contains several vestiges of Norman architecture: it has a naïve, with north and south aisles, two chancels, and a low square tower containing 5 bells. The register dates from 1582. The living is a vicarage, with the chapelry of Leigh, net income £324, with residence, and 180 acres of glebe, in the gift of John Swinford, Esq, of Minster Abbey, Thanet, and held by the Rev. Smithett Swinford, M.A., of Trinity College, Cambridge. Adjoining the churchyard are the remains of a monastery, surrounded by a moat, converted into a farmhouse. There is a school. The village is pleasantly situated; the river Isis, or Thames, runs through it on one side of the road or street, and the bridges over it, leading to the houses, give it a picturesque appearance. There are remains of four ancient stone crosses in different parts of the village. There are two charities, called Hawkin's and Chapman's, both invested in land, now producing together £58, £39 per annum of which is given to the poor, and £19 for apprenticing poor children. Here are places of worship for two dissenting congregations. The Duke of Cleveland is lord of the manor and is also the chief landowner. The soil is gravel and clay; the subsoil is very variable. The chief crops are grass, wheat, barley and roots. The population in 1861 was 1,070; and the number of acres inclusive of Leigh is 3,820. Leigh is a township and chapelry belonging to Ashton Keynes, near the river Thames, in Highworth hundred, and union of Cricklade, 31/4 miles west-bysouth from Minety station, containing 312 inhabitants. Here is a charity, producing from £24 to £30 per annum.
