Baverstock

Church Missionary Jubilee – Meetings were held on Monday evening at Barford, when a collection was made; and on Friday evening, at Baverstock, when a collection was also made.

(*Salisbury and Winchester Journal* – Saturday 4 November, 1848)

The Treasurer of the Salisbury Infirmary reports the following collections from the under mentioned parishes after Divine Service on Wednesday last, the day of Humiliation, paid by the respective Clergymen:-

.....Dinton, 3 l. 1 s. 6 d.; Baverstock, 3 l.;

Patriotic Fund – The collection in the parish of this place (Baverstock) amounted to 14l. 3s. 4d. A considerable quantity of new flannel clothing and of old linen has also been forwarded to Scutari from the ladies of that and some adjoining parishes.

Church Missionary Society – Sermons in behalf of this Society are announced to be preached tomorrow morning and evening, at St. Thomas' Church, by the Rev. N. J. Moody, and meetings held on Monday, at twelve and half-past six, at the Council Chamber.- Meetings will also be held at Wilton on Tuesday evening, and at South Newton on Thursday evening, and a sermon preached at Bishopstone on Wednesday evening. – During the week, sermons have been preached at Fisherton, Burcombe South

Newton, and Woodford, and meetings held at Woodford, Baverstock, Knoyle, Compton, and Barford, in behalf of the same Society.

The collection made in this parish for the Indian Famine fund, after a sermon by Archdeacon Hony, amounted to 5 l. 3 s. 8 d.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal – Saturday 4 May, 1861)

The day of humiliation was observed in this parish on Wednesday, the 7th instant. The alms and collections for the Salisbury Infirmary, amounted to 3l. 10s. On Thursday evening, the Rev. T. Spratt, from Tinavelly, preached in aid of the Church Missionary Society.
