Baverstock

BAVERSTOCK includes the hamlet of HURDCOTT, and is a parish and village 8 miles W. from Salisbury, and 5 W. from Wilton, in the hundred of Branch and Dale, and Wilton union, South Wilts. The living is a rectory, value £300, with 70 acres of glebe land and residence, held by the Ven. Archdeacon William Edward Hony, B.D., in the gift of Exeter College, Oxford.

The church of St. Edith is in the Decorated style, with a square tower at the west end, and three bells.

The population in 1861, including Hurdcott, was 168.

Charles Penruddock, Esq., is lord of the manor of Baverstock; Alexander Powell, Esq., lord of that of Hurdcott. The acreage of both is 1,168 a. 34p.

There is a Free school, kept up by the rector. Hurcot, or Hurdcott, is 1 mile S.E.
