1801

Committed to the House Of Correction, Devizes.

Oxford Journal, 2 May 1801

Thomas Nobes, of Bishopstone, for four months.

1828

Committed to the House Of Correction, Devizes. William Elijah Major Cripps, of Bishopstone; for three months. Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 30 October 1828

Committed to the House Of Correction, Devizes. John Lawrence, charged with breaking open the brewhouse of William Grub, of Bishopstone, and stealing divers articles of wearing apparel. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 27 November 1828**

1834

Committed to the House Of Correction, Devizes. William Jones for one month, for vagrancy in the parish of Bishopstone. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette**, **6 November 1834**

1837

James Large and William Gibbs, for stealing 4 horse shoes at Bishopstone: one month and to be whipped once. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette**, 6 April 1837

1843

Committed to Marlborough Bridewell William Heulett and James Cooke, for trial, charged with stealing barley, the property of Peter Dore of Bishopstone.

Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 27 April 1843

Committed to Marlborough Bridewell property of Peter Dore at Bishopstone.

John Smith, for trial, charged with stealing timber, the Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 27 April 1843

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes beat Rosanna Turner, at Bishopstone.

Stephen Payne, for two months, for having assaulted and **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette**, **4 May 1843**

Wilts Quarter Sessions William Hewlett, aged 26, for stealing barley, the property of Peter Dore at Bishopstone: Seven years transportation. Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 6 July 1843

Wilts Quarter Sessions John Smith, aged 26, for stealing 3 pieces of ash plank at Bishopstone: Four months (imprisonment) Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 6 July 1843

1844

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes Edward Durham, for two months, for an offence at Bishopstone. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 14 November 1844**

1846

Wilts Quarter Sessions Thomas Hewlett and John Woolford, for stealing potatoes at Bishopstone.

Nine months (imprisonment)

Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 15 January 1846

1847

Wilts Quarter Sessions John Giles, foe stealing caol at Bishopstone. 18 months (imprisonment). **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette**, **19 August 1847**
