The Court Leet and view of Frankpledge of our Sovereign Lord The King together with the Court Baron of the Right Honorable Henry Richard Vafsal Lord Holland Baron of Foxley in the County of Wilts Lord of the said manor held in and for the same on Wednesday the twenty seventh day of September in the forty ninth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord King George the third and in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and nine before Stephen Moore Esquire Steward

*Unto this Court came Thomas Newbury a copyhold tenant of this manor and Susanna Neate widow and Executrix of George Neate a mortgagee of the premises hereinafter mentioned and here in full court in consideration of thirty five pounds paid to the said Susanna Neate in full of all principle and interest due to her and of One hundred and ninety pounds paid to the said Thomas Newbury making together the sum of Two hundred and twenty five pounds paid by John Povey of Bourton in the county of Berks Yeoman for the purchase of the said premises they the said Susanna Neate and Thomas Newbury did surrender into the hands of the said Lord by his Steward there by the rod according to the custom of the said manor **All that** one half yardlands with the appurtenances in Eastbrook within the manor aforesaid formerly in the possession of Elizabeth Keep but now of the said Thomas Newbury by copy of court roll bearing date the twenty fifth day of September One thousand seven hundred and eighty three for the lives of himself William Norris and Ann Norris And all the estate right title interest claim and demand whatsoever as well of him the said Thomas Newbury as of them the said William Norris and Ann Norris of in and to the same **To the intent** that the said lord might regrant the same to the said John Povey **Whereupon** at the same court came the said John Povey and here in full court took of the said Lord of the said manor by the hands of his Steward there by the and according to the and tom of the said manor **All** and singular the premises above surrendered with the appurtenances **To have and to hold** the said half yardlands and premises with their appurtenances unto him the said John Povey for the term of the lives of the said William Norris and Ann Norris and for the life of the longest liver of them successively at the will of the Lord according to the custom of the said manor **By** and under the yearly rent of five shillings and four pence and by all other works burthens heriots customs suits and services therefore due and of right accustomed and so the said John Povey is admitted tenant accordingly and did his fealty*
