

## RECTORS LIST For the parish of Brinkworth

## Rectors of Brinkworth With names of Patrons and Dates of Institution

A Norman Church existed here before the present one. The date it was built is not precisely known, and there is no record of the earlier Rectors. But the Rectory was given, by the name of BRYKELSWORTH, during the reign of Henry I. (1100-1135) to the Cathedral Church of Old Sarum and in the reign of Stephen (1135-1154), by the name of WRYNCHEWURTH, for the use of the Master of a School there. In the Charter of Confirmation by Henry II. (1154-1189) it is called BRYGHTELESWORD.

Buried St. Mildred, Bread St. (See Wood's Ath.Ox. & D.N.B.). The Holy Table, the Silver Chalice and Flaggon and the Pulpit were presented to the Church while he was Rector.
