

Post Office Directory Extract 1875

Broad Blunsdon



Blunsdon St. Leonard (or Broad Blunsdon) is a tithing and ecclesiastical parish, formed out of the parish of Highworth in 1864, within the parliamentary borough of Cricklade, in the Northern division of the county, hundred and union of Highworth, county court district of Swindon, diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, archdeaconry of Bristol, and rural deanery of Cricklade, distant from Highworth 3½ miles south-west, 5 north from Swindon and 80 from London.

The church of St. Leonard is a handsome structure, and consists of chancel and chancel-aisle, nave, and south aisle, with square tower containing 4 bells; it was completely restored in 1872. The register dates from 1679. The living, formerly a chapelry of Highworth, has been endowed by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners with £300 yearly, and constituted an independent rectory, in the gift of the Bishop of the diocese, and held by the Rev. William Harris Roach, M.A., of Pembroke College, Cambridge.

There is a school for boys and girls, built upon the church land, supported partly by the rector and partly by the weekly payments of the children. Here is a chapel for Primitive Methodists.

At Bury Town, in the parish, there is a camp and some old armour, in the possession of Mr Smith, a farmer there, was dug from a barrow near the camp.

The manorial rights are divided, and there are a number of landowners with separate holdings.

The soil is Clay and stone brash. The crops are grass, wheat, barley, beans and roots.

The area is 2,242 acres; the population in 1871 was 944.

Oldcroft, a quarter of a mile south, is the handsome residence of H C Crowdy, Esq.,; **Hyde** is a hamlet, 2 miles southeast.
