

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Broad Hinton with Broad Town



Broad Hinton is a township, parish, and extensive and widely scattered village in Marlborough Union, partly in the Hundred of Silkley, and partly in the Kingsbridge, Cricklade parliamentary borough, North Wilts, distant 8 miles northwest of Marlborough, 5 south-east from Wootton Bassett, 6½ south-west from Swindon, and 89 from London, surrounded for many miles by open downs. The church is an ancient edifice, with square embattled tower; the interior was repaired about 1850. The living is a vicarage, value about £500, in the patronage of the Master of St. Nicholas Hospital, Salisbury, and enjoyed by the Rev. William Cookson, M.A. The population is 714; and the acreage, 3,659. There is a small school, endowed with £20 per annum by the late lord of the manor, Thomas Bennet, Esq.

Broad Town is a hamlet and ecclesiastical district, 1 mile north-west. The ecclesiastical district contains a population of 246 in Broad Hinton parish, and 193 in Cliffe Pypard. There is a church. The living is an incumbency, in the patronage of Broad Hinton and Cliffe Pypard; absolute value, £50 per annum.

Uffcott is another hamlet; Elm Cross is quarter of a mile east; The Win, half a mile north-east; Manor Copse quarter of a mile north; Conegar and Cockroost, half a mile north; Sand Furlong, 1 mile north; Bincknoll, 1½ miles north; Bassett Down, and Quiddington, 2 miles north-by-east; Little Town and Cobler's Hall, 1½ miles north; Honey Hill, 2 miles north: Cotmarsh, 3 miles north

Post Office - Mrs. Mary Hunt, receiver. Letters arrive by foot post from Swindon at ½ past 9 a.m.; dispatched thereto at ¼ to 6 p.m. The nearest money order office is at Wootton Bassett.

Church - Rev. William Cookson, M.A., vicar; Rev. John Thomson, M.A., curate.

Endowed School - john Daly, master; Mrs. Mary Ann Daly, mistress
