CALNE, HILMARTON & LYNEHAM TURNPIKE ROADS

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Tolls arising at the several Toll Gates, called or known by the names of Calne Gate and Lyneham Gate, situate on the second district of road comprised in an Act of Parliament intituled "An Act for more effectually repairing the roads leading from Swindon to the centre of Christian Malford Bridge, from Calne to Lyneham Green, and from the Direction Post in Long Leaze Lane near Lydiard Marsh, to Cricklade, in the county of Wilts," will by LET by AUCTION to the best bidder, at a meeting of the Trustees of the said Turnpike Roads to be held at the house of MR. CHARLES PINNIGER, called LANDSDOWNE ARMS INN, in Calne aforesaid, on Wednesday the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December next, between the hours of eleven and two o'clock, for a term of three years, to commence from the first day of January next, at noon, (but to be determinable at the end of the first or second year at the option of either party), in the manner directed by the Acts passed in the third and fourth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the fourth, "For regulating Turnpike Roads," and such reduced Tolls will be put up at such sum as the Trustees shall think fit.

Whoever happens to be the best bidder, must at the same time pay in advance one twelfth part of the rent at which such Tolls may be let, and give security with sufficient sureties to the satisfaction of the said trustees of the said Turnpike Roads for payment of the rest of the money monthly by equal installments.
