## **Christian Malford**



**Christian Malford** is a parish and village, in the Northern division of the county, North Damerham hundred, Chippenham union and county court district, diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, archdeaconry of Bristol, and rural deanery of Malmesbury south, 2 miles from Dauntsey railway station, 6 north-east from Chippenham, 8 south-west from Wootton Bassett, and 91 from London, situate on the Avon. The Great Western railway runs through the parish.

The church of All Saints is a very ancient structure, and has a chancel, nave, and south aisle, and tower containing 6 bells. The register dates from the latter part of the seventeenth century. The living is a rectory, yearly value about £800, including 116 acres of glebe, with residence, in the patronage of the Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, and held by the Rev. Robert Vanbrugh Law, M.A., of St Peter's College, Cambridge, treasurer of Wells Cathedral.

Here is an excellent National school for about 150 children of both sexes.

The trustees of Sir Henry Meux, bart., are lords of the manor and the principal landowners.

The soil is rich loam; subsoil, clay. The chief crops are wheat and beans.

The parish contains 3,104 acres, mostly meadow land; gross estimated rental, £12,830 8s; rateable value, £9,427 4s; the population in 1871 was about 885.
