OPC Note:

William Annetts was baptised in Collingbourne Ducis on 5th November 1831 son of Stephen and Hannah Annetts.

The 1841 census shows the Annets family living in Cadley, Collingbourne Ducis:-Stephen Annets, 30, Ag lab; Hannah Annets, 30; Charles Annets, 12; William Annets, 9; John Annets, 7; Richard Annets, 5; Thomas Annets, 3; George Annets; 1

The 1851 Census records the family still in Collingbourne Ducis:-

Stephen Annetts, 40, Ag Lab; Hannah Annetts, 41; Charles S. Annetts, 20, Ag Lab; William, Annetts, 18, Ag Lab; Richard Annetts, 14, Ag Lab; George Annetts, 12, Ag Lab; James Annetts, 10, Scholar; Henry Annetts, 8, Scholar; Martha Annetts, 4, Scholar; Joseph Annetts, 2

All were born in Collingbourne Ducis apart from Hannah and Charles who were born in Collingbourne Kingston.
