

Gun Accident

On the afternoon of Friday, two children named Martha Dickenson, aged about fifteen years, and Honore Matthews, a younger girl, with others, were in the house of a woman named Fisher, which adjoins the premises occupied by the parents of the former. During the afternoon the girl Dickinson went into her house, took a loaded gun, which had been left there by her grandfather, and following Honore Matthews, pointed the weapon at her, which went off, the whole charge entering the poor girl's right thigh. She was at once taken to her own home, and Dr. Futcher was sent for, who has carefully attended the sufferer, and we are glad to say that hopes are entertained of her recovery.
