

Drunk and Disorderly

Disorderly Conduct.

William Hailstone, of Collingbourne Kingston, and Joseph Annetts and William Waters, of Collingbourne Ducis, three young men, were summoned for being drunk and disorderly at Collingbourn Kingston, on Sunday night, the 25th August. The charge was proved by Sergeant Luffman, who stated that defendants, with others, were in the habit of coming to Collingbourn Kingston on Sunday evenings and getting drunk and then creating disturbances in the street. They were all convicted, and Hailstone and Waters were fined 17s each, including costs. Annetts did not appear, but the service of the summons being proved, the charge was heard in his absence.
