

Death of Captain Charles Wyndham

Killed, aged 34, in a severe engagement with the Ghilzies, in action at the Gundurnuk Pass, between Cabool and Jellahabad, in Afghanistan, on the 29th October last, Captain Charles Wyndham, of the 35th Bengal Native Infantry, youngest son of George Wyndham, Esq., of Roundhill Grange, Somersetshire, and nephew of the late William Wyndham, Esq., of Dinton, in this county.

This very gallant and spirited Officer was in the act of rallying his men, when he unfortunately fell. He had on previous occasions signally distinguished himself by his zealous and resolute conduct. He was sincerely beloved by his brother, Officers and all the Camp, and is deeply lamented by his family and friends.
