In the name of God Amen I William Meggs of Donhead St. Mary in the County of Wilts gent being in good heath of both body and of sound & p[er]fect mind & memory Praise be given to Almighty God revoking all former Wills by me made doe make and ordaine thie my last Will & Testament in manner & forme following first I comend my soule into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me hopeing to have pardon and forgiveness of all my Sinns through the merritts bitter passion of my only Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ & my body I comitt to the earth to be decently buried att the discression of my Executrix hereafter named And as touching the disposition of all such temporall Estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I give and dispose thereof as followeth

First I will that my debts & funeral charges shall be paid & discharged.

Item: I give unto my brother Ferdinando Meggs one shilling.

Item: I give unto to brother John Meggs Twenty shillings.

Item: all the rest of my goods moveable & unmoveable my debts & legacies being paid I give & bequeath unto Elizabeth Meggs my now wife whome I make my whole & sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament and I doe appoint & devize my leving coz: John Bennett of Barwick in ye County of Wilts Gent to be my Overseer & as much as in lyeth to see this my last will and Testament p[er]formed & for his care that he shall take theirin I doe give him Two shillings & six pence to buy him a pair of Gloves.

In Witness whereof I the said William Meggs have hereunto put my hand & seale the Tenth day of November in the Five & Thirteth yeare of the raigne of ye Soveraign Lord Charles the second pver England &c.
