

Service at St. Paul's

Famous Institutions Represented

In celebration of the tercentenary of the birth of Sir Christopher Wren a special service was held in St. Paul's Cathedral yesterday (Thursday) afternoon. The Lord Mayor and sheriffs attended in state, and nearly 100 members of the City Corporation.

Many learned societies were officially represented. The President of the Royal Society (of which Wren was one of the founders) and over 30 Fellows of that body attended, and the Royal Academy was represented by the Presidents and Many Royal Academicians. There were also present members of the Royal Institute of British Architects, the Royal Astronomical Society, The Royal Society of British Sculptors, the Cathedral Works and Representative Committees, the London Society, the Wren Society, the Association of Architects and Surveyors, the Architectural Association, the St. Paul's Ecclesiological Society, the Association of Clerks of Works, and the Society of Wiltshiremen.

The service consisted of a shortened form Evensong with special music and special prayers.

In the Crypt, wreaths will be laid on the tomb of Sir Christopher.
