Ebbesbourne Wake

Ebbesbourne Wake is a parish and village in the Southern division of the county, hundred of Chalke, Wilton union, Salisbury county court district, Hindon petty sessional division, Salisbury diocese and archdeaconry and Chalke rural deanery, 12 miles south-west from Salisbury, 9 south-west from Wilton, 9 east from Shaftesbury and 97 from London. It takes its name partly from the river Ebele, being in the Bourne, upon its banks, and Wake, from a former lord of the manor.

The church of St John the Baptist is in the last stage of decay and will shortly be pulled down. The register dates from 1656. The living is a vicarage, yearly value £80, with 46 acres of glebe, in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury, and held by the Rev. Tupper Carey, M.A., of Christ Church, Oxford, rural dean, rector of Fifield Bavant.

Here is a National school and an Independent chapel.

The Earl of Pembroke, who is lord of the manor, and John Rebbeck, esq., are the principal landowners.

The soil is loam and clay; subsoil, chalk and flint. The chief crops are barley, wheat, oats &c.

The area is 2,762 acres; gross estimated rental, £2,736; rateable value, £2,466; the population in 1871 was 338.
