

Dora Everett Lever

Dora Everett Lever was the daughter of Harry Lever and his wife Martha, and was born in Fovant in 1886.

The 1891 census shows her family at Fovant, Harry Lever, 33, carpenter, Martha (nee Futcher), 30, Dora E, 4, Cecil, 2 and Baby William, just 1 month old, as well as her grandmother, Mary A. Futcher.

The family had moved to Great Wishford by 1892, and the 1901 census and the Lever family are: Harry, 43, a carpenter and employer, Martha, 40, Dorah, 14, Cecil, 12, William G, 10, Edgar, 6, Bertie, 4 and Ella M, 2.

By 1911 census, Harry, 53, is a carpenter working on his own account, Martha, 50, Dora, 24, is assisting at home, William is a bricklayer apprentice, Edgar, a carpenter, and Bertie, 14, Ella, 12 and Alan Charles, 9, all are scholars.

Two of Dora's brothers were killed during World War I; William George Lever, died 18 October 1916 and Bertie Lever died, aged 21, on 31st August 1917 and whose grave is in Wishford Churchyard. Her brother Edgar Harry Lever was severely wounded.

Dora Everett Lever married Robert J. Stevens 1919 in the Wilton district. Dora and her husband emigrated to Australia.
