

Great Chalfield, Tithes

I, the Undersigned, Richard Warner, being tithe owner within the parish of Great Chalfield, in the county of Wilts, whose interest is not less than one fourth part of the whole value of the tithes of the said parish, do by this notice in writing by my hand call a Parochial meeting of landowners and tithe owners within the limits of the said parish, for the purpose of making an agreement for the proposed commutation of tithes within the limits of the said parish, pursuant to the provisions of an act passed in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of his present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the Commutation of Tithes in England and Wales;" And I do hereby also give notice that such a meeting will be held at Chalfield House, in the said parish, on Monday 19th day of June next, at the hour of eleven in the forenoon – Given under my hand this eighteenth day of May 1837.

The whole tithes of the parish of Great Chalfield aforesaid are estimated at the annual value of one hundred and eighty pounds, subject to poor and other parochial rates, and belong to the said Richard Warner, as Rector of the said parish.
