

Wilts. Society Wedding

Captain Fuller and Miss Hambro

A wedding of great interest in society and all other circles in Wiltshire was solemnised in the historic little church at Great Chalfield Manor, near Melksham, on Tuesday.

The contracting parties were Captain Christopher Fuller, Royal Wiltshire Yeomanry, second son of the late Sir John M. F. Fuller, a former Liberal Member of Parliament for West Wiltshire and Governor of Victoria and of the late Mrs. Forestier-Walker, and Miss Susan Hambro, daughter of the late Sir Percy Hambro and of Lady Hambro 12 Egerton Gardens, London.

The Rev Philip M Barry, vicar of Bradford on Avon officiated.

The bride, who was given in marriage by her brother, 2nd Lieut. E. B. Hambro, 15/19 Hussars, was attired in a white and silver gown, with train and a wreath of orange blossoms on a veil. She carried an ivory family prayer book.

There were no bridesmaids.

Captain Sir Gerard Fuller Bart, of The Life Guards, elder brother of the bridegroom was the best man.

The hymns were "Praise My Soul the King of Heaven" and "O Perfect Love."

Following the wedding members of the respective families were present at a reception held at Great Chalfield House, by kind permission of Major and Mrs Robert Fuller.
