

Bankruptcy of John Trubridge

Salisbury County Court

A Court for the Relief of Insolvent Debtors was held yesterday, before Edward Everett, Esq., when the following cases were heard:

John Trubridge, described as late of Great Wishford, in the county of Wilts., of no occupation, next came up for hearing. He was opposed by Mr. Whatman (of the firm Squarey and Whatman) on the part of Mr. Frederick Shergold, and was supported by Mr. Lock, attorney, of Dorchester. The debts of the insolvent amounted to £206 8s., being £150 for damages and £56 8s. costs, incurred in an action brought by the opposing creditor against the insolvent for the seduction of his daughter, a very young girl. The Judge considered it a very bad case, and commented severely upon the heartless conduct of the insolvent, who was ordered to be remanded for 12 months from the date of the vesting order.
