

Bankruptcy of Francis Tutt

Wishford Bankruptcy

On the 18th instant, at three o'clock in the afternoon, at the office of Mr. F. Hodding, solicitor, Market House, Salisbury, in the matter of Francis Tutt, of Wishford, butcher, a first meeting will be held of creditors for the election of a chairman who can receive proof of debt and claims against the petitioner's estate, for the production of a statement of affairs by the debtor, and a majority of the creditors present or represented by proxy to nominate a receiver or trustee of the estate and effects, and decide by resolution in writing, whether the same shall be wound up under liquidation or bankruptcy, pursuant to the bankruptcy law, and rules and orders passed thereunder.
