

Great Wishford Station

Robbery at Wishford Railway Station

During Sunday night the booking office at the Great Western Railway at Wishford was entered and £10 stolen. The thief obtained admittance to the office by breaking the window near the fastening. He then proceeded to a drawer which contained 10s worth of coppers and the key of the iron safe. The safe, which was enclosed within a cupboard, containing £6 15s and a cheque for £3 5s, made payable Messrs. Pinckney's bank to the station master. The thief apparently used but little force to break open the drawer, and the cupboard containing the iron safe had been left unlocked, is remarked as singular that the thief should not have interfered with the coppers in the drawer, and that instead of letting himself through the office door, after committing the robbery, he returned through the window. The matter is under investigation by the police.
