Frederick Snook listed Mr David George Stone, Farm Bailiff, of Bishops Fonthill, near Salisbury as the person to contact regarding his character. Mr Stone stated that Frederick Henry Snook had been employed by him as an under Carter for 4 years & was leaving to join the Army. He stated that Frederick was "very civil & willing & trustworthy".

Gunner Snook was posted to Royal Garrison Artillery at Citadel, Plymouth & posted to 43rd Battery on 13th June, 1913. He was transferred to 8th Battery on 31st December, 1913. Gunner Snook served in the Gibraltar Campaign from August, 1914 to 14th February, 1915.

Gunner Snook was transferred to 35th Siege Battery on 15th February, 1915. Gunner Snook was appointed (paid) Acting Bombardier on 15th February, 1915 & was serving "At Home" from 15th February, 1915 to 14th September, 1915. Acting Bombardier was serving in a Theatre of War - France from 16th September, 1915. He was promoted to Bombardier on 11th January, 1916. Bombardier Snook was promoted to Corporal on 1st April, 1917.

Corporal Snook was posted to Base on 20th October, 1918. He was attached to 35th Siege on 5th November, 1918.

Corporal Snook was appointed Paid Acting Sergeant on 23rd January, 1919. He was appointed as Acting Battery Serjeant Major on 1st April, 1919.
