



Transfer of License Delayed for Two Hours

The parties who had business at the court today were kept waiting for two hours for the attendance of a second magistrate, Mr. Saunders being the only magistrate out of eight who seemed to have any regard for the business of the public. After hunting the town for two hours, Mr. Moulton's attendance was secured.

Licenses

The license of the Three Lions Inn, Holt, was transferred from J. Beak to William Deverell; that of the Red Lion Inn, Atworth was transferred from Samuel Lewis Simpson to William Dixon, of Christian Malford; and that of the Barge Inn, Avoncliffe, was transferred from John Dowling to William Norris, of the Cross Guns, Avoncliffe. Protection was extended to George Sidnell, who applied for a transfer of the King's Head, Bradford.
