The bride was dressed in white charmeuse with pearl girdle, and wore a long Brussels lace veil, circled by a fillet of orange blossom, was given away by her father, and attended by Miss Margery Bruce as bridesmaid. The bridegroom, who had returned from the action before Cambrai on the previous day, was supported by Major A. Gallaher, D.S.O., 4th Dragoon Guards.

The ceremony was performed by the Rev. Canon Carnegie, Rector of the parish, assisted by the Rev. Harold Gibb, who was wounded in France while serving with the 4th Dragoon Guards, early in the war.

The chancel was beautifully decorated with white lilies and palms.

A large party of relations and friends of the bride and bridegroom were present, and adjourned afterwards to 36, Grosvenor Road, Westminster, where the bride's parents are at present residing. The wedding cake, which was cut by the bride before leaving for the honeymoon, was decorated with natural flowers.
