Sale of Farming Stock

On Thursday Messrs. Ewer and Winstanley submitted to public competition a choice dairy of 21 cows, several heifers, barreners, and yearlings, 18 useful cart horses, and 40 store pigs, together with the dead farming stock, and other effects of Mr. Brown, who is quitting his farm. The horses fetched good prices, the highest realising £50 8s., and others £44 and £42 each. The cows sold well, the highest reaching £15, a good price considering the present unfavourable season of the year. The dead farming stock went off very well, and on the whole the sale was most satisfactory. At one o'clock a numerous party sat down to lunch in a large barn. Mr. W. Ferris presiding, and Mr. W. B. Canning occupying the vice-chair.
