Inquest of Frederick Taylor

An inquest was held on Friday afternoon, at the Plough Inn, before the Borough Coroner, Mr. Alfred Buckeridge, on the body of Frederick Taylor, the infant child of George & Mary Ann Taylor, of High Street, Hungerford.

Mary Ann Taylor, mother of the deceased, said the child had been ailing from its birth. The child was not well on Thursday, but they thought it was cutting some teeth and they did not send for a doctor. The child died in the night.

Dr. Harman said he was called at four o'clock that (Friday) morning and found the child dead. It had always been delicate. The mother had always followed out his directions as to treatment.

The verdict was "Death from natural causes".
