Died in Hospital at Cologne of Phthisis. He had been a Prisoner of War from 23rd March 1918										
John Richmond Pugh was a gardener at the Greathouse from late 1911. In 1914 he joined the Wiltshire Yeomanry and later joined the 6th Battalion Wiltshire Regiment. Why Jack was working at the Greathouse is as yet unknown.

News Paper Obituary : PUGH. In loving memory of Private Jack Pugh, who died as a prisoner in Cologne, December 5th 1918. “He has entered life eternal. We shall see him no more. One by one we'll number with him when our pilgrimage is o'er.” Sadly missed by his loving father, mother, sisters and brother, and Elsie, Wem Road, Clun.
