John Greathed Harris, Esq., one of her Majesty's Commissioners for relief of Insolvent Debtors, held a Court in this city on Wednesday last. There were only two cases before the Court. The first being **Jacob Coster**, of Little Hinton, who had been sued for a debt of his father-in-law, for which he had become surety. The plaintiff was Mr Read, of Marlborough, brewer. The insolvent was indebted to five or six other persons in small sums. It appeared that he was very respectably connected, but by improvident habits, and marrying against the wishes of his friends, he had incurred their displeasure; but being, an only child, it was probable his liabilities would be eventually paid in full. Mr Read was appointed assignee, and the insolvent was discharged forthwith.
