

# Crime and Punishment

*Crockerton* 1750-1849

# 1765

Bath Yesterday one Lloyd, of Lullington, in this county, a lad about 11 years of age, was committed to prison, charged with breaking open two dwelling houses, at Crockerton, in the county of Wilts, and stealing from thence a gold watch and fifty guineas, on Monday night last. Tis said he is an old offender. Bath Chronicle and Wiltshire Gazette, 25 July 1765

#### 1804

Salisbury On Wednesday, William Dyer, of Crockerton, was committed to Fisherton Gaol, for trial at the next Assizes, charged with having stolen a lamb out of a field at Crockerton, the property of Mr John Charlton, of Longbridge Deverell. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 29 October 1804

### 1805

Salisbury The Assizes for this county William Dyer, convicted of having stolen a lamb out of a field at Crockerton; were all sentenced to be transported for seven years. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 18 March 1805

# 1825

Committed to Fisherton Gaol: Silas Hiskett, charged with burglariously breaking into the house of John Lewis, of Crockerton, and stealing various articles of wearing apparel. Elias Hiskett charged with stealing one steel from the house of John Lewis, of Crockerton. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 24 October 1825

Committed to the House of Correction, Devizes Enoch Payne of Crockerton, for three months, for breach of the Game Laws. Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 13 October 1825

#### 1826

Wilts Assizes Hard labour in Devizes House of Correction Silas Hiskett breaking into and robbing the house of John Lewis at Crockerton: twelve months. **Bath Chronicle and Wiltshire Gazette**, **16 March 1826** 

#### 1839

Committed to the New Prison at Devizes John Curtis, for two months, for leaving the service of Daniel Hurd, at Crockerton. Wiltshire Independent, 28 February 1839 & Devizes & Wiltshire Gazette, 28 February 1839

# 1840

William Maxfield, of the Horse and Groom beer-shop, at Crockerton, was fined £1 and costs, for allowing beer to be consumed in his house before 1 o'clock on Sunday the 16th August.

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes John Ruddickford of Crockerton, for two months, for breaches of the game laws. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 19 January 1843**
