# Longbridge Deverill 1850-1899

### 1867

Hindon Petty Sessions, Wednesday 5th June. Before Robert Graves, Esq., John Lock, Esq., and Lord Arundell. William Cowley, of Longbridge Deverill, summoned for allowing his horse to stray on the highway in the parish of East Tisbury, on the 11th of May, was fined 2s. 6d. and costs. Western Gazette, Friday, 7 June 1867

#### 1869

At Warminster George Down, and Edward Paine, two lads, were summoned for assaulting Mary Ann Whatley, a young girl, of Longbridge Deverill, on 31st May. Case dismissed. **Western Gazette**, 11 June 1869

## 1872

Richard Carpenter was charged with having been drunk at Longbridge Deverill, on 11th October. Fined 10s. Western Gazette, 15 November 1872

#### 1874

Committed to the county gaol, Devizes for the week ending July 7, 1874 Joseph Ball, fourteen days for drunkenness at Longbridge Deverill . **Wiltshire Independent, 9 July 1874** 

#### 1879

James Brown was charged with ill-treating a cow at Longbridge Deverill, but the Bench dismissed the case. Western Gazette, 18 July 1879

# 1880

Jackson Ball, Frederick Ball, and Richard Carpenter, fell labourers, were charged with taking six pheasant's eggs, from land in the occupation of Mr. W. B. Dufosee, belonging to the Marquis of Bath, situate at Longbridge Deverill on morning, 25th April. Frederick Ball and Richard Carpenter were dismissed; Jackson Ball was fined 6d. each egg and 7s. costs. Western Gazette, 14 May 1880

# 1888

Benjamin Ball, John Trollope and Alfred Whatley, of Longbridge Deverill, were bound over to keep the peace for three months for creating a disturbance at that place on October 22nd. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, Thursday, 8 November 1888**
