



Emigration to Canada - Crockerton Man Finds Prosperity

Crockerton. A young man who went from this district to Peterboro', Canada West, five or six years ago, has just written to his friends informing them of his prosperity. Masters and servants, he says are pretty much upon an equality, and wages are good, labourers receiving 5s to 6s a day, while food, of the best description, is cheap. This summer, the writer and his brother-in-law, received 8s a day each for wheeling bricks; he remarks that he would not be able, now, to live upon 10s or 12 s a week. The information may be of use to those who think of emigrating.
