## **Ludgershall Inclosure Statement of Claims Notice 1851**

I, FRANCIS ATTWOOD, of the Close of the City of New Sarum, in the County of Wilts, the Valuer acting in the matter of the INCLOSURE of the COMMON called Spray Leaze and No Man's Ball, situate in the parish of Ludgershall, in the county of Wilts, hereby give Notice that a STATEMENT of all CLAIMS received by me in the matter of the said INCLOSURE has been deposited at the Queen's Head Inn, in the said parish for the Inspection of all Persons interested in the said INCLOSURE.

And I further give Notice, that any Objection to a Claim must be delivered in writing to me, and a copy of such Objection must also be delivered at the Place of Abode of the Claimant or his Agent on or before the twenty-seventh day of September instant.

Given under my hand this second day of September, in the year of our Lord 1851 FRANCIS ATTWOOD.
