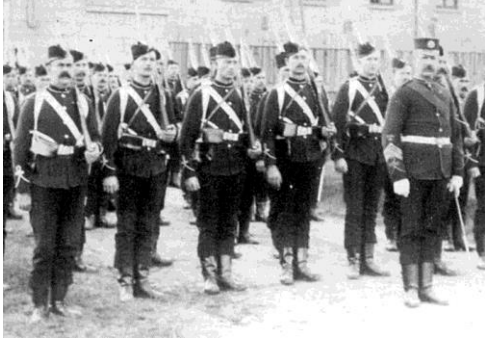


Military Matters

The Royal Wilts Militia, Lieutenant-Colonel Lord Methuen, quartered in Portsmouth garrison, are showing their zeal for the exigencies of the national service.
