

Kellys Directory Extract 1889 North Bradley



NORTH BRADLEY is a parish comprising the tithings of NORTH BRADLEY and SOUTHWICK, in the Western division of the county, hundred and petty sessional division of Whorwellsdown, union of Westbury and Whorwellsdown, county court district of Trowbridge, rural deanery of Potterne Bradford portion, archdeaconry of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury: North Bradley is 2 miles south from Trowbridge, 3 north-west from Westbury, 7 north from Warminster and 7 north-east from Frome. The river Biss flows through the southern portion of the parish. The church of St. Nicholas is of mixed architecture, built of stone, and consists of chancel, nave of six bays, transepts and five aisles, south porch and an embattled western Norman tower, with clock and 6 fine toned bells: it was restored about the year 1863 at a cost of nearly £2,000, raised by subscription: the east and west windows are stained: it contains a magnificent monument to Lady Emma, mother of John Stafford, archbishop of Canterbury, erected in the year 1480, and a mural monument to John Trenchard, the author, ob. 1723, and several to the Long family, Henry Long, 1727, Ellen Long, 1752, and William Long, 1773: there is a remarkable old Gothic font: there are 300 sittings. The register dates from the year 1665. The living is a vicarage, tithes commuted at £640, with 4 acres of glebe land and residence, in the gift of Winchester College, and held since I885 by the Rev. Wyndham Arthur Scinde Merewether M.A. of Oriel College, Oxford. St. Thomas', Southwick, a chapel of ease to St. Nicholas, is an iron building, consisting of chancel, small turret with a bell: there are 120 sittings. There are chapels for Baptists; also an asylum for four poor persons, with the annual allowance of £10 each, founded in 1810 by Archdeacon Daubney. A charity of £3 was given by Mrs. Rachael Long, in 1781, to six poor families of this parish. W. H. Long esq. M. P., D.L., J.P. of Hood Ashton House, is lord of the manor. The principal landowners are Winchester College, John Trask esg., William Roger Brown esg. J.P., Highfield, Hilperton, and W. H. Laverton esq. of Leighton House, Westbury. The soil is clay; subsoil, clay. The area is 4,036 acres, which is principally pasture; rateable value of North Bradley, £5,834, and of Southwick, 5,444; the population in 1881 was 1,886-887 in Bradley and 999 in Southwick.

SOUTHWICK tithing is 1½ miles west. Southwick Manor Court was the residence of Archbishop Stafford; it is surrounded by a moat: the ruins of the chapel may still be traced: it is now occupied as a farm house by Mr. William Reakes.

POST OFFICE.-Mrs. E. Gerrish, receiver. Letters through Trowbridge, arrive at 7 a.m. & 6.40 p.m). & are dispatched at 6.45 p.m. Trowbridge is the nearest money order office & West Ashton the nearest telegraph office. Postal orders are issued here, but not paid. Letters for Road arrive through Bath, at 7.30 a.m. & 7.45 p.m.

POST OFFICE, Southwick.-Job Long, receiver, Letters through Trowbridge, which is the nearest money order & telegraph office. Letters arrive at 7.30 a.m. & 7.10 p.m., dispatched at 9.15 a.m. & 7.15 p.m. Postal orders are issued here, but not paid.

SCHOOLS

A School Board of 5 members was formed June 21st 1880; Rev. W. A. S. Merewether, hon. clerk to the board; Alfred Hall, attendance officer.
