

Kellys Directory Extract 1915 North Bradley



NORTH BRADLEY is a parish comprising the tithings of North Bradley and Southwick, in the Western division of the county, hundred of Whorwellsdown, union of Westbury and Whorwellsdown, petty sessional division and county court district of Trowbridge, rural deanery of Potterne (Bradford portion), archdeaconry of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury: the village is 2 miles south from Trowbridge station on the Great Western railway, 3 north-west from Westbury, 7 north from Warminster and 7 north-east from Frome. The river Biss flows through the southern portion of the parish. The church of St Nicholas is a building of stone in the Perpendicular style, and consists of chancel, nave of six bays, transepts, aisles, south porch and an embattled western tower, containing 6 bells, rehung in 1894, at a cost of £200: the east and west windows, and two others are stained, and there are monuments to Elizabeth, 2nd wife of Sir Humphrey Stafford, d.1446, and mother of John Stafford, Bishop of Bath and Wells, 1425-43, and Archbishop of Canterbury, 1443-52, and a mural monument to John Trenchard, a political writer (d.17 Dec 1723), and several to the Long family, including Henry Long, 1727, Ellen Long, 1752, and Wm Long, 1773: the church was restored about 1803 at a cost of nearly £2,000, and affords 278 sittings. The register dates from the year 1641. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £380, with 4 acres of glebe and residence, in the gift of Winchester College, and held since 1908 by the Rev Donald Francis Ogilvy Poulter MA of Lincoln College, Oxford. There is an iron mission church at BROKERSWOOD, erected in 1905, and seating 80 persons. The Baptist chapel, built in 1775, and enlarged in 1803, and 1831, will hold 500. The Progressive hall and institute, built in 1912 by subscription, contains a hall seating 200 persons; there is a billiard and reading room. There is an almshouse for four poor persons, with a monthly allowance of 16s each, founded in 1810 by Archdeacon Daubeny, who also built, in 1818, the vicar's poor house for 6 poor persons. A charity of £3 was given by Mrs Rachel Long, in 1871, to six poor families of this parish. Mr E T Green is lord of the manor. The principal landowners are Winchester College and William John Mann esq. of Highfield, Trowbridge. The soil is clay; subsoil, clay. The area of North Bradley is 1,768 acres, which is principally pasture; rateable value, £4,839; the population of North Bradley in 1911 was 1,619, 818 in Bradley and 801 in Southwick, including Roadhill. The population of North Bradley ecclesiastical parish in 1911 was 1,402.

YARNBROOK is a hamlet three-quarters of a mile south-east. Here is a Baptist chapel, built in 1874, to hold 110.

SOUTHWICK is a village and tithing, 1½ miles west. St Thomas's, a chapel of ease to St Nicholas, erected in 1904 at a cost of £3,000, is a building of stone in the Gothic style, consisting of chancel, nave and north-west tower, with small spire, containing one bell: at the west end is a baptistery for adult baptisms: there are 200 sittings. Here also is a Baptist chapel, founded in 1655, erected in 1815, and seating 350; and a Particular Baptist chapel, erected in 1861, with 150 sittings. Southwick Manor Court, now a farm house, and the property of Mr Christopher William Reakes, was the residence of Archbishop Stafford; it is surrounded by a moat, and the ruins of the chapel may still be traced. The area is 2,312 acres of land and 7 of water; rateable value £4,776.
