

Tragic Death Of Staff Sergt. Edgar William E. Gifford

The death is announced as a result of enemy action on Thursday in this country of Staff-Sergt. Edgar William E. Gifford, of the R.A.O.C., at the age of 30 years.

Staff-Sergt. Gifford was the son of Mr. John E. Gifford of Cheltenham, but formerly of Wallbridge Mills, Frome, and the late Mrs. Gifford.

He married Miss Kathleen Nash, daughter of Mr .and Mrs. F. Nash, of St. George's Terrace, Trowbridge, and it was only a few months ago he and his wife came to reside at 'Appledore', North Bradley. In his younger days he was a pupil at a Frome school, and when he joined the Forces about 18 months ago he attended the Royal College of Science at Woolwich. Later he went to France and was successfully evacuated from Dunkirk.

There is one little son, two years of age, and he also leaves three sisters and one brother.

The funeral took place at St. Nicholas' Church, North Bradley, on Tuesday afternoon, when the service was conducted by the Rev. Canon S. D. M. Davys, M.A.

The coffin was draped with the Union Jack and there was an escort from the Trowbridge Barracks accompanied by three buglers from the C. L. B., under Bandmaster F. Conner, who sounded the "Reveille" and "Last Post". Staff Sergeant Relf, who was in the same unit, and a friend of the deceased led the escort.

Mr. Leslie Watts played suitable music on the organ, and the hymns sung were "O God, Our Help in Ages Past." And "Lead, Kindly Light."
