## Pítton and Farley 1800-1849

#### 1843

Committed to Fisherton gaol: George Whitlock of Pitton and Farley, for six weeks, and further fourteen days on a second conviction, for poaching at Clarendon Park. **Devizes and Wiltshire** Gazette, Thursday 26 January 1843

#### 1845

Committed to Fisherton gaol: Henry Shergold, of Pitton and Farley, and Edward Lawrence of Wilton, for twenty one days each, for poaching. John Garrett, of Pitton and Farley, for fourteen days, for poaching. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Sat 20 December 1845

#### 1847

Committed to Fisherton Gaol Isaac Bray, of Pitton and Farley, one month for poaching. **Devizes** and Wiltshire Gazette, 23 September 1847

### 1848

Committed to Fisherton gaol. Jos. Harris, of Pitton and Farley, for fourteen days, an assault. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Saturday 25 March 1848

#### 1849

County Petty Sessions. Present; the Viscount Folkestone and Edward Hinxman, jun., Esq. George White and Herbert Parsons, two young men, labourers, of Farley, were fined 20s. each, including costs, for trespassing on land in the occupation of Mr John Noble Curtis in the pursuit of rabbits, on the 31st ult., at Farley. Parsons paid his fine, but White being unable to do so was sent to the house of correction for one month. On the hearing of this case his lordship left the court, he being the owner of the land trespassed on. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal Saturday 18 August 1849**
