

Post Office Directory Extract 1875 Pitton & Farley



FARLEY is a parish, 6 miles east from Salisbury, in the hundred and union of Alderbury. The church of All Saints is a cruciform brick building, with tower, erected by Sir Stephen Fox, in 1688, to replace" an ancient ruined chapel" on another site; it was restored in 1874, and has five stained windows and a handsome reredos of Caen stone, marble, alabaster and mosaics; it has seats for 181, all free, and contains several fine monuments, one in the nave by the younger Westmacott; and in the north transept those of the founder Sir Stephen Fox, his two wives, and one of his sons, whose bodies (with those of many of his descendants belonging to the two noble families of Ilchester and Holland), lie in the vault beneath. The register dates from the year of 1665. The living is a vicarage, with the chapelry of Pitton annexed, joint, early value, £300, in the patronage of the Bishop of Salisbury, and is held by the Rev. John Farnham Messenger, M.A., of Lincoln College, Oxford, who is also warden of Farley hospital, for six poor men and as many aged women, which was founded by Sir Stephen Fox in 1682.

There is a National school.

Pitton is a chapelry and township 6 miles north-east from Salisbury. The church of St. Peter is a very plain old edifice, consists of chancel, nave, north transept, and low belfry (with 1 bell) on the south side, through which is the entrance; small crosses surmount the east and west gables: it has seats for 250, one half of the sittings being free. The living is annexed to Farley. There is a National school. The area of Farley and Pitton is 2,157 acres; gross estimated rental, £2,874; rateable value, £2,617; population Farley, 282; and of Pitton,357.
