1769 – Prisoners for debt

The following persons being prisoners for debt, in the respective prisons or goals, hereinafter mentioned, do hereby give notice, that they intend to take the benefit of an act of parliament, passed in the 9th year of the reign of his present Majesty King George the third, intituled, an act for the relief of insolvent debtors, at the next general or quarter sessions of the peace to be held in and for the county, riding, division, city, town, liberty, or place, or any adjournment thereof, which shall happen next after THIRTY days from the FIRST publication of the under mentioned names, viz.
