- Lot 1. TWO COTTAGES, ORCHARD, and piece of Arable LAND, about 2 acres (more or less) called Sugerwell, now in a high state of cultivation, held under the Lord Bishop of Salisbury, for two lives of the respective ages of 26 years and 50 years.

 Also a Piece of LAND, called Well's Croft, adjoining the above, containing 3R. 8P. held under three lives of the ages of 37, 53, and 56 years; the whole in the occupation of William Martin, as yearly tenant.
- Lot 2.
