There is a substantial BARN upon the Premises, in which might be stored the produce of the land, thus rendering unnecessary any additional outlay in the erection of new buildings for that purpose.

The Property is bounded by the Churchyard of Rowde, by lands of **Wm. Hughes**, esq., and the public highway: and from the fact of other Freehold Land in that parish being principally held by wealthy owners, the present opportunity holds out advantages not likely to be again realized in the village of Rowde.
