

Post Office Directory Extract 1875 South Marston



SOUTH MARSTON is a tithing and village in the parish of Highworth, Northern division of the county, hundred and union of Highworth, Swindon county court district, near the Wilts and Berks canal and Great Western Railway, and distant from Highworth 3.5 miles south, 3 west from Shrivenham station, 74 from London, and 3.5 east from Swindon station. The church of St. Mary Magdalene is a plain structure, partly in the Early English style, with traces of Norman: the font is a very perfect specimen of Norman; the arch at the west end is a very fine Gothic one, and the west window, in the tower, is a beautifully decorated Gothic. The register dates from the year 1539. The living is a chapelry, annexed, with that of Sevenhampton, to the vicarage of Highworth, and held by the Rev. James Charles Norman, M.A., of Magdalen College, Oxford; the Rev. William Henry Bath, M.A., is curate. There is a Wesleyan chapel. A handsome National School has been erected at the cost of A. Bell, esq., who is lord of the manor and chief landowner. The crops are chiefly grass. The area is included with the parish of Highworth; the population in 1871 was 410. ROWBOROUGH, Roman settlement, is half a mile south-east.
