

Kellys Directory Extract 1867 Steeple Ashton



Steeple Ashton is a large and considerable village, parish, and petty sessional division, in the Northern division of the county, hundred of Whorwellsdown, Westbury union, county court district of Trowbridge, rural deanery of Pottern, archdeaconry of Wilts, and diocese of Salisbury, 4 miles east from Trowbridge, 5 miles south from Melksham, 105 from London, 9 south-west from Devizes, and 10 from Warminster. The church of St. Mary is a noble Gothic stone structure, with buttresses and crocketed pinnacles, and consists of naïve, north and south aisles, chancel, and square embattled tower containing 6 bells and a clock: it was built in the latter end of the fifteenth century. The register dates from 1538. The living is a vicarage, with the chapelry of Semington annexed, joint annual value £852, in the gift of the Master of Magdelen College, Cambridge, and held by the Rev. Richard Crawley, M.A., of that college. Here is a National school; also, a Primitive Methodist and a Baptist Chapel. Richard Pentuddocke Long, Esq., M.P., of Rood Ashton House, West Ashton, is lord of the manor and principal landowner. Fossils have been found in large quantities in the parish at various times. The Kennet Canal lies 2 miles north. The special and petty sessions of the peace for the division of Steeple Ashton, West Ashton, Hinton, Keevil, Bulkington, North Bradley, Southwick, East Coulston, West Coulston, Tinhead, Baynton, and Edington are held on the first Monday of every month at the 'Long's Arms.' HINTON is a tithing of this parish.

DUNGE is one mile south-east.
