

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Steeple Ashton (Including West Ashton)



Steeple Ashton and West Ashton - Steeple Ashton-Cum-Hinton, a large and considerable village, township and parish, 4 miles east of Trowbridge, 5 miles south from Melksham, 105 from London, 9 south-east from Devizes, and 10 from Warminster, in the Hundred and division of Whorwellsdown, and Westbury Union, North Wilts. The church of St. Mary is a noble fabric, with square tower and 6 bells; was built in the latter end of the 13th century, and is one of the finest parish churches in the county. The living is a vicarage, in the gift of Magdalene College, Cambridge, of the annual value of £800, now enjoyed by the Rev. Richard Crawley, M.A. The population in 1851, was 802 in the township and tithing; its area is 2,800 acres, which chiefly belongs to Walter Long, Esq., M.P., lord of the manor who resides at Rood Ashton House, a splendid Gothic mansion, situated a little west of the village. The parish includes West Ashton & Great Hinton, with a total population of 1,857. Here is a Primitive Methodist chapel, also a National school. Fossils have been found in large quantities in the parish at various times. The Kennet canal lies 2 miles north.

West Ashton, a pleasant village and tithing of the same parish, 2 miles south of Trowbridge, and 3 north from Westbury, contains 324 inhabitants; its area is 2,000 acres, which belongs to Walter Long, Esq., M.P., lord of the manor. The church of St. John is a neat modern built structure, with 1 bell, and a fine-toned organ, stone pulpit, and reading desk. The living is a perpetual curacy, of the annual value of £200 in the gift of W. Long, Esq., M.P.; and the Rev. Francis Henry Wilkinson, M.A., is the incumbent. Here is a National school for boys and girls, erected and chiefly supported by W. Long, Esq., and the incumbent.

Dunge is 1 mile south-east.
