



Bankruptcy of John Waldron

The Commissioners in a Commission of Bankrupt awarded and issued forth against John Waldron, late of Stratton St. Margaret in the County of Wilts, dealer and chapman, intend to meet on the 5th day of June, 1766, at ten of the clock, in the forenoon, at the house of Crook Godby, known by the name of the White Horse in Cricklade, in the said County, in order to make final Dividend of the said Bankrupt's Estate and Effects; when and where the Creditors, who have not already proved their Debts are to come prepared to prove the same, or they will be excluded the Benefit of the said Dividend. And all persons having made any Claims, are to come and prove the same, or they will be disallowed.
