1820

Committed to Fisherton Gaol. John Browning, charged on the oath of Margaret Dore, shopkeeper of Stratton St. Margaret, with having, on the 11th instant, disposed of and put away a forged £5 Bank of England note, with intent to defraud the Governor and Company of the Bank. 1822

Garlick of the parish of Swindon, were on Thursday last, convicted before the Magistrates of Swindon, in penalties and costs of £1 1s. 6d. each for going over certain lands and grounds, not being a public highway, for the purpose of defrauding the Rushey Platt Turnpike toll gate.
