Kembrey Park

Named after George Kembrey who built the first houses on the approach road to the old Ammunition works, originally called Gorse Hill Business Park.

Plessey's moved onto the site in 1940 eventually employing 2,300 by 1950, August 1957 saw a strike over downgrading of chargehands. The site was then taken over by Kembrey Engineering in 1980s.

Bluebird Toys - *The Mulberrys SN2 6YP* - Sir Torquil Patrick Alexander Norman founded Bluebird Toys in 1980, his first successful toy was the famous Big Yellow Teapot, made from hardwearing plastic to create a modern take on the traditional doll's house. It was followed by the Big Red Fun Bus and Big Jumbo Fun Plane. also well known for its Polly Pocket, Mighty Max was launched in 1992 More than eighty different sets were created, as well as a tie-in video game, battle cards, watches and backpacks. It was bought out by Mattel and Swindon HQ closed in 1998.
